BLACK NEW YORKERS ARE AT A GREATER RISK

Extreme heat is the deadliest impact of climate change, but no one feels the heat as much as communities of color – particularly Black New Yorkers. According to City data, 50 percent of the heat-related deaths in New York City are among Black/African American people, even though they make up only 25 percent of the city's population. And the Heat Vulnerability Index map shows a strong correlation between heat vulnerable communities and communities of color and low-income.

WE ACT for Environmental Justice has been working to reduce the greenhouse gas emissions that fuel climate change as well as to help communities adapt to the adverse health impacts of the climate crisis – such as extreme heat. That is why we wanted to share these cooling assistance resources with you.
