Re: Fiscal Year 2026 (FY26) Funding Request for the Environmental Protection Agency and Environmental Justice Programs

Dear Chair Murkowski, Ranking Member Merkley, Chair Simpson, and Ranking Member Pingree,

We write this letter as organizations accountable to environmental justice communities and allies of our movement. As you begin developing the Fiscal Year 2026 Interior, Environment, and Related Agencies Appropriations Bill, we urge you to ensure that the bill fully funds the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) at \$12 billion, including full funding for the agency's environmental justice offices and programs. Furthermore, we call for the immediate release of grants Congress appropriated through the Bipartisan Infrastructure Law (BIL) and Inflation Reduction Act (IRA) that have been illegally frozen by the current Administration. Finally, we call for assurances that the EPA and offices responsible for critical environmental justice initiatives will be reinstated, preserved, and fully staffed.

Decades of research has consistently found that low-income communities, communities of color, and Tribal communities are more likely to be exposed to pollution, hazardous waste, toxins, and other environmental hazards. This disproportionate exposure leads to detrimental health outcomes in these environmental justice communities, such as asthma and other respiratory illnesses, cardiovascular diseases and conditions, cancer, and premature death.

Furthermore, due to historic and systemic underinvestment, these communities are also at the frontlines of the climate crisis, facing extreme heat, natural disasters, and other devastating impacts.²

Over the past few years, Congress and the federal government had begun collaborating with environmental justice communities to address these decades-long injustices across the country. The BIL and IRA included critical investments such as \$3 Billion in Environmental and Climate Justice Grants, \$27 Billion for the Greenhouse Gas Reduction fund, \$1 billion for Clean Heavy Duty Vehicles, amongst countless other programs. Similarly, environmental justice communities have counted on the EPA to perform its statutorily required responsibility to develop and enforce crucial regulations under bedrock environmental laws such as the Clean Air Act, Clean Water Act, Safe Drinking Water Act, and Toxic Substances Control Act.³ The EPA must continue to be fully funded and staffed so that it can resume disbursing funds appropriated by Congress, and carry out its lawful role in developing and enforcing environmental regulations vital for the health and safety of communities. Communities deserve to realize the benefits of the cleanup of legacy pollution, advancement of justice and equity, and achievement of economic empowerment in their own neighborhoods.

This administrations' unprecedented attack on environmental justice communities has been cruel, blatantly racist, not based in science or fact, and will lead to hundreds of thousands of people across the country needlessly losing their lives to pollution and toxins.⁴ It is basic fairness and justice to restore communities who have borne the brunt of environmental injustice, while simultaneously being intentionally locked out of environmental policy decision making processes. All people deserve clean air, clean water, and healthy environments, regardless of their skin color or where they live.

We urge you to ensure that the EPA is funded at a full \$12 billion, including the agency's environmental justice programs and offices. Furthermore, we call for an immediate release of the funding appropriated by Congress through the BIL and IRA, and now contractually obligated to be dispersed to states, non-profits, and other groups and organizations. Funding that has been illegally frozen includes the Environmental and Climate Justice Block Grants, Greenhouse Gas Reduction Fund, Air Pollution Monitoring Grants, Diesel Emissions Reductions Grants, Clean Ports Grants, Clean School Bus program, funds to replace lead service lines, and numerous other life-saving programs. Finally, we call for assurances that the unlawfully terminated

environmental justice staff from within the EPA will be reinstated, and critical offices will be preserved and fully staffed.⁶ These include the EPA Office of Environmental Justice and External Civil Rights and regional environmental justice offices across the country.

Data shows that repealing IRA incentives would have drastic economic impact, increasing household electricity costs by more than \$110 next year, threatening more than \$500 billion in planned economic investment, and leading to 1 million fewer jobs by 2030.⁷ Similarly, reporting has indicated that 85% of the funding from the IRA has benefited Congressional districts represented by Republican Members of Congress.⁸ In fact, your Republican colleagues across both chambers have repeatedly called for protections of critical IRA tax credits that have created jobs and protected public health in their respective districts.⁹ Environmental justice communities are your communities and these community members are your direct constituents. We urge you to stand up for your constituents and end this Administration's relentless attack on our fundamental human rights to clean air, safe drinking water, and healthy environments where we can live, work, learn, play, and pray.
